This map illustrates the total number of years of school attendance required by each state, based on each state's compulsory school attendance requirement. Compulsory school attendance refers to the minimum and maximum age required by each state at which a student must be enrolled in and attending public school or some equivalent education program defined by law. For example, in Alabama the minimum compulsory age is 7 years old – meaning that students must attend school by age 7 – and the maximum compulsory age is 17, meaning students cannot leave school before age 17. Thus the mandatory number of school years in Alabama is 10.
