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Constitutional Language: State Obligations for Public School Funding

Each state is obligated to provide its residents with a system of public education under the rules of their constitution; however, the specific type of education each state must supply varies. This ECS StateNote provides the language in each state's constitution that pertains to state obligations for public school funding. It includes links to each constitution and reference points for state funding of religious education and disabled student services, as well as age and school year provisions where applicable.
