


#### What is Education Choice?




Every child deserves access to a quality education that provides the knowledge, skills, and values necessary to prepare them for a successful career and fulfilling life.

Charter schools are **publicly-funded**, **independently-operated schools**. They operated under a performance contract with an authorizer (e.g. a district, the state, or other entity) and receive more autonomy in exchange for greater accountability.

The charter construct is simple, yet profoundly different than traditional district schools.


If a charter school is failing, close it.

#### Charter School Growth








#### **States with Charter School Laws**




#### 45 states + D.C. + Puerto Rico + Guam have Public Charter School Laws












#### States with Private Education Choice Programs
