Students use a variety of [funding sources](#) to pay for college. Students enrolled in public postsecondary institutions receive a total of

\$198 MILLION in federal financial aid, state financial aid, institutional financial aid and student loans.

#1 North Dakota State Student Incentive Grant Program

\$8.8 million disbursed to **6,562** recipients.

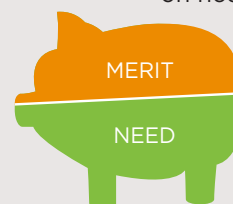
#2 North Dakota Academic Scholarship

\$3.8 million disbursed to **2,718** recipients.

48.9% is disbursed on merit.

51.1% is disbursed on need.
