Students use a variety of [funding sources](#) to pay for college. Students enrolled in public postsecondary institutions receive a total of

\$934 MILLION in federal financial aid, state financial aid, institutional financial aid and student loans.

State Financial Aid

Largest financial aid programs 2015-16:

#1 Oklahoma's Promise

\$63.6 million disbursed to **18,894** recipients.

#2 Oklahoma Tuition Aid Grant

\$19.5 million disbursed to **22,476** recipients.

Of all state aid in Oklahoma,

11.5% is disbursed on merit. **88.5%** is disbursed on need.
