
Role of a Steering Committee Member

A Steering Committee Member of the Education Commission of the States (ECS) serves as the leader of their state's delegation of appointed Commissioners and plays a critical role in facilitating communication between the states and the Commission. One ECS Commissioner from each state is appointed to serve on the Steering Committee.

Steering Committee members serve a two-year term with the possibility of reappointment. Their leadership helps strengthen education policy research at both state and national levels.



ECS Current Steering Committee Member Representation

Steering Committee members' key responsibilities include:

- Leadership and Coordination: Provide leadership among their state's appointed Commissioners and coordinate state visits by ECS staff with key education policy leaders.
- Budget and Dues Management: Work with ECS staff to ensure that their state's budget includes annual dues and assist in the collection of these dues.
- **Committee Involvement**: Serve on standing and special committees as needed.
- Participation in Meetings: Attend and participate in Commissioners' business sessions, which are held twice a year during the Winter Commissioners Meeting and the National Forum on Education Policy.

Steering Committee members have the opportunity to represent their state on one of ECS' standing committees, including:

- Nominating Committee, which selects our annual awards recipients, Steering Committee Members.
- **Finance Committee,** which approves our annual income and expenditures.
- Executive Committee, which provides strategic direction and oversight for the management, operations and financial policies.
- National Forum Planning Committee, which provides feedback that informs our annual convenings.
- Future Issues Committee, which supports the identification of education policy priorities to address in our research.
