



Trump FY 18 Budget Proposal: Losses in Need-Based Aid by State

Under President Trump’s proposed 2018 budget, the Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG) stands to be eliminated, while Federal Work-Study would be reduced by 49.49%. The chart below estimates the potential losses states could face in need-based grants and work-study available to postsecondary students based on funding levels from the 2015-2016 academic year.
