How are students using financial aid in your state?

Students use a variety of [funding sources](#) to pay for college. Students enrolled in public postsecondary institutions receive a total of

\$638.3 MILLION in federal financial aid, state financial aid, institutional financial aid and student loans.

\$6.1 million disbursed to **(N/A)** recipients.

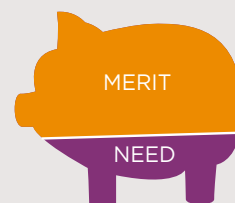
#2 Higher Education Success Stipend Program
