How are students using financial aid in your state?

Students use a variety of [funding sources](#) to pay for college. Students enrolled in public postsecondary institutions receive a total of

**\$202.7 MILLION** in federal financial aid, state financial aid, institutional financial aid and student loans.

### State Financial Aid

Largest financial aid programs 2015-16:

#### #1 Vermont Incentive Grant

**\$14.9 million** disbursed to **8,786** recipients.

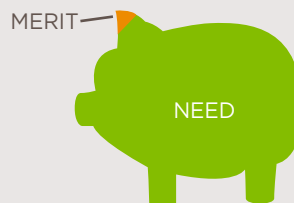
#### #2 Non-Degree Grant

**\$2.9 million** disbursed to **1,757** recipients.

Of all state aid in Vermont,

**2.4%** is disbursed on merit.

**97.6%** is disbursed on need.
